#### The Birth of Jesus & God's Providence

Galatians 4:1-7

#### I. The Providence of God & the Fall (v. 1-3)

- A. Man was hopeless due to the Fall (Genesis 3)
  - 1. Man through disobedience broke fellowship with God
  - 2. Man was placed under the curse of death (Genesis 2:16-17)
- B. Man lived under the burden of Law and works (Gal 3:10-11)
  - 1. Man was left to pursue God by works of righteousness (Isaiah 64:6)
  - 2. Man was cursed to live life of hopelessness
- C. Man was left to the shame of his fall
  - 1. We are laid bare with no covering for our sin
  - 2. We are completely dependent upon the grace of God

## II. The Providence of God & His Provision (v. 4)

- A. The redemption of man would occur in God's perfect timing
  - 1. The prophecies were fulfilled
    - In respect to preparation of Israel
    - In respect to the time in history
    - In respect to the sovereign plan of God
  - 2. The moment of redemption was epic
    - It has forever divided time concerning our history
    - It disrupted the governing authorities
    - It altered man's potential for fellowship with God
- B. The providence of God was detailed
  - 1. The forerunner would be born first
  - 2. The town of birth would be fulfilled (Micah 5:2)
  - 3. The way of His birth was fulfilled (Isaiah 7:14)
- C. The providence of God identified with man
  - 1. He would live obediently under the Law
  - 2. He would experience the heartaches and temptations of man (Hebrews 4:14-15)
  - 3. He would exchange our sin for His righteousness (2 Cor 5:21)

## III. The Providence of God & Our Redemption (v. 5-7)

- A. Our redemption was not a last minute solution
  - 1. God planned it before the institution of time (Eph 1:4-5)
  - 2. God's redemptive plan was revealed immediately following the Fall (Gene 3:15)
- B. Our redemption places us in a permanent relationship our heavenly Father (v. 5)
  - 1. We are adopted by God
  - 2. We are placed in a place of security by God Himself
- C. Our redemption brings about a change in our present and future (v. 7)
  - 1. We leave behind the bondage of sin
  - 2. We become as a son/daughter
  - 3. We are an heir that ends ultimately in our glorification (Romans 8:28-30)
